#### The 2017 Delta Company Reunion in Tucson

This Special Issue of Delta's Newsletter includes the information you need to reserve your place at Delta's Reunion. On the front page, President Dwight Edwards explains the importance of bonds forged in combat a half century ago. Below and elsewhere we describe this special event. A Registration Form accompanies this newsletter. We hope to see you at the Desert Diamond Resort in Tucson, Arizona, October 3-6, 2017.

#### Your Reunion Overview

You'll arrive in Tucson on Tuesday, October 3. If by air, call 520-342-3000/3100 for Desert Diamond's free Shuttle Service to the resort at 7350 S. Nogales Highway.

Check into the hotel, get your Reunion Information packet, then take time to freshen up before you board the shuttle at 6:00 PM for our Welcome Dinner at AmVets Post 770. Return to the resort hotel at 9:00 PM, some may turn in after a day of travel; others will visit with old and new friends in Delta's Hospitality Room, open until midnight or so.

On Wednesday morning, use a \$5 voucher (or two if double occupancy, each day) for breakfast (or any other meal) at any of Desert Diamond's restaurants.

Mid-morning, board a shuttle for a visit to the *Pima Air and Space Museum* (www.pimaair.org). After arrival, we'll board a tram for a 1.5 mile guided tour of the more than 150 aircraft in outdoor areas. Then we're released to tour the five indoor hangers housing another 150 aircraft and other exhibits on the museum's 80 acres. Reunion committee members who visited in January were impressed by the huge and varied display of aircraft (and spacecraft), military and civil, from every era of flight. Lunch at your leisure in the Flight Grill or in the on grounds 390th Bomb Group Memorial Museum's Pilot Grill.

We'll return to the Resort between 2 and 3 PM where our Hospitality Suite on the 4th floor of the North Wing will be open into the late evening. Thursday is our "big day," starting with the Memorial Service for those we lost in battle.

We'll take a break to see off the Significant Others on their shopping/lunching trip to *The Village of Tubac* 40 miles south before Delta's business meeting.

The historic Arts & Crafts community at the base of the Santa Rita Mountains in Southern Arizona is home to more than 100 galleries and some of the world's finest artists. Have a Southwest lunch at Elvira's or Le Entrada de Tubac, International at Ragazzi, Shelby's Bistro, or The Italian Peasant. Be in style in jeans and cowboy hat on Tubac Jack's outdoor patio. Those are just few of many places to shmues & nosh in a break from the shopping.

After our meeting, we'll spend time relaxing in the Reunion Hospitality Room, then get ready for the banquet before the ladies return, so they'll have our rooms to themselves to get ready.

At 5 pm we have a cash bar in the Conference Center Foyer (the bar will remain open throughout the banquet and socializing until 10 pm). The banquet meal will be preceded by *Presentation of The Colors, The Missing Man Table, and our Traditional Military Toasts.* After, *Delta Company Medal of Honor recipient Allen Lynch will speak, plus more still being planned.* 

We'll socialize in the banquet room until 10 PM when we can adjourn to our Hospitality Room for farewells, perhaps into the "wee hours."

Friday is our departure day, so be sure to confirm times for the resort's airport shuttle before you turn in. Have a safe trip. We hope to see you again soon.

#### Fading Away to Fiddler's Green

Remarks of Delta's First Vietnam Commander to the 12th Regiment, Branson 2016

Good Evening and Welcome. I'm John Gergulis. Permit me to take a few moments of our time together...to share with y'all a few very personal thoughts and deeply held feelings.

Y'all each know a bit about the Brothers of the 12th Cavalry Regiment and the 1st Cavalry Division, but let me share a few first-hand memories of how we became the Airborne and Airmobile Cavalry of Vietnam fame.

As young Captain of Infantry, I left Korea in the summer of 1963 for Fort Benning, Georgia and the 1st Battalion (Airborne) 187th Infantry (Rakkasans). Over the next two years we developed, trained and tested whether and how to fight from and with helicopters.

I had the command of Delta Company, very young draftees and volunteers of many backgrounds and races, from all over the country. Mostly angry at themselves, the army, the world, society in general, and without focus, purpose, or direction. They were 17, 18, 19 years of age, fresh out of airborne school. Few were graduates of high school or possessed a GED certificate. These kids were itching for a fight - any fight! We were fortunate enough to have a few - very few - slightly older qualified non-commissioned officers, some with combat experience in Korea, some WWII. They were the bedrock of Delta Company, the 12th Cav, and Our Army.

Not many of us are left, fading rapidly away to Fiddler's Green with each passing day. Several of the original brothers who served together at Fort Benning, Georgia during1963 - 1965, are here with us today. CSM (then SSG) Luther Nixon, LTC (then private) Charles Rose, Reverend (private) Dwight Edwards, is now President of our Delta Company Association, Brothers Mike Van Kirk, John Spranza, and Colonel (then Captain) Billy Lord, Battalion Chaplain at Benning and in Vietnam.

Brother Dieter Arnold planned on joining us here, but was unexpectedly called home to Fiddler's Green earlier this year. The lesson is clear: You never know when your number will be called. Dieter had no warning. I for one do not want to miss the opportunity to share with my Brothers - ever! Don't wait until you get the call that one of your Brothers has been called home. And, in the name of our Heavenly Father, please, don't find yourself standing at a Brother's grave site at Arlington or elsewhere, as I have too many times, mourning their passing, regretting not having shared with them that you were blessed to have them in your life.

To all my 12th Cavalry Brothers, most especially my cherished Delta Company Brothers, thank you for being in my life, for permitting me to stand with you, for accepting me as a member of your awesome team, for bringing so much hope, inspiration, and joy into my life since - and yes, even during - too many bleak and tragic moments we shared. I'm honored to have had the privilege to stand and to serve with you. No one is more proud of y'all, as individuals and together. You will be forever deeply respected, and loved. Your selfless accomplishments and many sacrifices for all of us are forever etched in history. You never flinched, you never asked 'what your country could do for you' and you never failed to accomplish the many missions thrown at you. It is my fondest wish and prayer that your Heavenly Father continue to heap upon you and yours the many joys and blessings of life on this awesome journey we share. Some gave some – some gave all. If not, you have them in your military records which can and should be requested. Everyone should have a full copy of all their military records. You might be surprised what you find. It's free, Just ask, and The National Personnel Records Center https://www.archives.gov/st-louis will mail them to you.

Fred Mac Lennan submitted more names he has found resulting from the General Orders search he accomplished at the National Archives. As a result, the late period Roster has grown to 310 names. The total Roster count for all periods is now 965.


